Mayflower Presses and Gets Cider

On Thursday, October 21st, The Mayflower Community celebrated the fall harvest with a dinner and homemade cider. The events started with an old-fashioned pressing of the apples to make the cider on the Buckley Courtyard veranda.

In the words of Foodservices Director, Scott Gruhn, "The cider press in use was owned and operated by Warren Grant, a long-time Grinnell-Newburg and international school educator and coach."

"Warren learned the apple cider press process from family members while still a college student and knew that he wanted to plant his own trees some day and continue the cider making tradition. When Warren and wife Terese moved to Grinnell to teach, Warren decided to purchase his own press so he could make cider. He planted trees in their yard and, in addition, helped friend and fellow educator, Ron Deppe, plant trees at his farm."

"Each fall when the apples were ready, Warren would invite friends, neighbors, and fellow church members to pick and press apples and enjoy the cider. Warren was so well known for his Johnny Appleseed traditions that when he passed away in 2017, family and friends honored Warren by pressing apples for cider. Terese wanted the tradition to continue, so she donated the press to the Deppe family where Warren's plantings still produce."

Scott borrowed the press from Ron Deppe, who is married to Scott's sister Cindy.

The afternoon cider-making resulted in the primary beverage for the 5:00pm social, which was followed by the Mayflower's annual Fall Harvest Dinner. The dinner menu included Apple, Squash, and Roasted Beet Salad; Roasted Pork Loin with a Black Berry Sauce; Roasted Walnuts and Brussel Sprouts; Mashed Sweet Potato; and for desert, Spiced Pumpkin Swiss Roll

Seating in Mayflower's Buckley Dining Room was limited to 60 for COVID-19 precautions. In addition, a large number of residents carried out their order to enjoy the fabulous meal at home.

The dining event was hosted by the Mayflower Residents Association Social Committee, chaired by Harriet Adelberg. The Mayflower Food Services department made the arrangements and provided the food... and cider!


Non-Veterans may purchase this meal for \$15 by calling and reserving your meal by the same methods noted above and by the same deadline.

German Artifacts in the Mayflower Treasure Chest

The Mayflower Residents Association's "Treasure Chest" display for the month of November will be a variety of craft items from Germany. The beautiful six-and-a-half foot tall curio cabinet that houses rotating collections is located in the Mayflower Community Pearson building lobby.





The November display will be a vintage collection of decorative items made in Germany. My parents, Forrest V. and Betty Schwengels, were stationed with the U.S. Air Force in Wiesbaden, Germany from 1946 to 1949. Things were pretty dismal for the German people after the war and the Schwengels frequented favorite craftspeople to help them make a living.

As part of the display, you will see hand-carved wood, porcelain, and German silver items. The best items they brought back with them were two additional children (a boy and girl) born

there who joined their older brother. I was 3 months old when I returned to the States.

Betty Schwengels lived in The Mayflower Community from 2001 until her passing in 2005, first in a Pearson apartment and later in Beebe Assisted Living and the Health Center.

HYBRID Mayflower Residents Association Council Meeting

The Mayflower Trustees were successful in holding a recent meeting in hybrid form, with some Trustees attending in person at the Drake Community Library (to take advantage of its "OWL" capabilities) and others joining by Zoom.

The Mayflower Residents Association officers hope to be comparably successful with the next Council meeting on November 15th at 2:00 pm. We will provide the option either to meet in-person in the Kiesel Theatre or to participate by Zoom. Committee chairs will be reporting on recent activities and future plans. All Mayflower residents are invited to attend, although only Council members are allowed to vote.

A Zoom link for this meeting and other relevant material will be sent closer to the meeting time. If this experiment proves successful, we will also use a hybrid presentation for the December 6th MRA Town meeting.

The Executive Committee will be bringing a proposed amendment of the MRA Bylaws to the Council Meeting. Currently, Article VIII Financial Organization, Section 2 reads as follows: "The Finance Committee shall prepare an annual budget to be presented to the Council at the spring Town Meeting. This budget will be presented and voted on at the spring Town Meeting."

The new proposed wording is as follows: "The Finance Committee shall prepare an annual budget to be presented to the Council at its spring meeting. This budget will be presented and voted on at the spring Town Meeting."

This amendment clarifies that the MRA budget process entails two steps. The Finance Committee first presents a proposed budget to the Council and, subject to amendment and approval by the Council, subsequently presents it to the spring Town Meeting.

November 6th: *Tommy's Honor* (2016) The inspirational, true story "old" Tom and "young" Tommy Morris, the real-life father and son duo that revolutionized the modern game of golf. Set against the



early days of the sport, the film follows the challenging and complex relationship between the two as they grow into golf legends. PG. 110 minutes. English subtitles.

November 13th: *My House ion Umbria* (2003) A train, traveling gently through the rolling hills of the Italian country side, explodes. There are only four survivors: "The General," an elderly English gentleman; Werner, a young German; Aimee, an orphaned eight-year old girl; and Emily Delahunty, an Ensligh novelist who invites them all to her home to recuperate. They find themselves attempting to rework the torn fabric of their lives. Will the magic of Emily's house bring happiness? Or, will happiness prove elusive as the answers to the questions that bind them together? Not rated. 103 minutes. English subtitles.

November 20th: *Sliding Doors* (1998) Funny and touching. One girl, two parallel lives. Gwyneth Paltrow plays London publicist Helen Quilley, effortlessly sliding between parallel story lines that show what happens if she does or does not catch a morning train back to her apartment. Deception, trust, friendship, comedy. All comes into focus as the two stories shift back and forth. PG-13. 99 minutes. English captions.

November 27th: *Staying On* (1981) This delightful drama, based on the award-winning novel by Paul Scott (*The Jewell in the Crown*) reunites Trevor Howard and Celia Johnson for the first time since *Brief Encounter*. Retired Indian Army Col. Tucker Smalley and his wife Lucy made the decision to stay on in India after the British withdrew in 1947. Residing peacefully in a bungalow annex of the run-down Smith's Hotel, their peace is about to be disturbed by hotel owner, Mrs. Bhoolabhoy, whose plans for the hotel and their bungalow will permanently change one corner of India that had remained previously England. Stunningly filmed at the hill station of Shimla at the foot of the Himalayas, a once-popular British retreat. Not rated. 90 minutes.
